## ST AUGUSTINE, WHERE WE ARE AS A PARISH AND PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

St Augustine died on the 28<sup>th</sup> August in the year 430. He had been Bishop of Hippo for 35 years. His own spiritual journey was constantly on the move, and he shared that journey with his people Sunday by Sunday. He thought deeply about his faith and when necessary he challenged those he felt to be in error. But at the same time he was constantly making overtures to those Christians who chose to separate themselves from the Catholic church. He also witnessed the gradual collapse of the Roman Empire which had provided stability for the Mediterranean world for so long. As he lay dying, the Vandals, guite literally were at the gates. Civilization seemed to be coming to an end.
